THE BRITISH WHITE CATTLE SOCIETY

Constitution, Rules and Bye-Laws

CONSTITUTION.

1. The name of the Society is the BRITISH WHITE CATTLE SOCIETY.
2. The Society shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and an unlimited number of Members whose names and addresses shall be registered by the Secretary in a book kept for that purpose.

The President shall be elected by the Annual General Meeting every other year, and the term of his office shall be for two years.

3. The entire control and management of the Society shall be vested in a Council, consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and 12 elected members, six of whom shall retire annually and be eligible for re-election.

RULES.

1. The objects for which the Society is founded are:—
 - (a) To encourage the breeding of British White Cattle.
 - (b) To establish and publish a Herd Book for them.
 - (c) To obtain classes, to augment prizes at Shows, and to recommend judges thereof.
 - (d) To investigate cases of doubtful and suspected pedigrees.
 - (e) To settle disputes and questions relating to, or connected with, British White Cattle.
 - (f) To promote sales by auction or by private treaty of registered British White Cattle.
 - (g) To take any action legally incidental or conducive to attainment of the above objects, or any of them.

2. The election of Members shall be vested solely in the Council and shall be by ballot.

3. Any person favourable to the objects of the Society and willing to conform to its rules shall be eligible for membership, but every candidate must be proposed in writing by a Member of the Society, and no person who has been expelled from any other breed Society shall be elected a member of the British White Cattle Society.

4. Any Member may withdraw from the Society on giving notice to the Secretary in writing, such retiring Member to have no claim whatever against the Society, and to be liable for his subscription for the current year in which such notice is given.

5. The annual subscription shall be three guineas (non-herd owning members, one guinea), payable on election, and subsequently on the 1st of January in each year; but no Member whose subscription is in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of the Society. Should any Member not have paid his subscription by the 30th April in any year, the Secretary shall send him notice by registered letter to pay the same, and should his subscription be still unpaid on 31st December in the same year, his name may be erased from the list of Members at the discretion of the Council.

6. Any Member violating the Rules of the Society shall be liable to be expelled by a vote of a majority of the Council, and any Member who shall, in the opinion of the Council, have been guilty or suspected of fraudulent practices in connection with live-stock or livestock shows, or have acted in any way derogatory to the interests of the Society, or the breed, or who for any other reason shall be deemed by the Council to be an undesirable Member, shall be expelled.

7. Should a vacancy occur on the Council or among the officers, the Council shall fill such vacancy from among the Members of the Society. The Members so elected shall be deemed to represent the Member whose place he takes, and shall retire when that Member's term of office would have expired.

8. The Council may appoint Committees for any special purpose, and may delegate to them such of the powers of the Council as they may think necessary. The President and Vice-Presidents of the Society shall be ex-officio Members of all Committees.

9. A General Meeting of the Society shall be held not later than the week of the Royal Show in every year, at such time and place as the Council shall appoint, and 14 days' notice shall be given to every Member of the Society. At such Meeting a Report

and Balance Sheet for the previous year shall be submitted, and the Officers and Council for the current year elected.

The said Annual Report and Balance Sheet, duly audited, shall be printed and circulated to Members with the notice calling the Meeting.

10. The Council may at any time, and upon a requisition signed by not less than six Members of the Society (specifying the business for which such meeting is required) shall summon an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Society. At such Extraordinary General Meeting no business may be transacted other than that for which such Meeting was specially summoned.

11. Every General Meeting shall have power to elect Honorary Members, to consider and vote on any report which the Council may present, and any resolution of which notice shall have been sent to every Member not less than 14 days previously. The voting at all Meetings shall be by show of hands, and the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

12. The Council shall have power to deal with any matter which may arise and which is not provided for in these Rules.

13. In all these Rules the word "he" shall be deemed to include the word "she".

BYE-LAWS.

1. The Herd Book shall include particulars of the pedigree of British White Cattle eligible to be entered therein, and such other information as the Council or General Meeting shall from time to time decide. The charge for entry in the Herd Book shall be £1 for males, 10s. for females, and 5s. for entry in the Grading-up Register. All fees shall be paid annually on application from the Secretary.

2. Up to a date to be decided by the Council, cattle of any age, which are partly of registered British White blood, may be entered in the Herd Book on inspection, provided they are, in the opinion of the inspectors eligible according to standard. Progeny of bulls imported from Sweden are eligible for registration on payment of the usual fees, provided the sire has been passed as eligible according to standard by a competent inspector appointed by the Council.

3. Every herd of over five animals must have a registered prefix, in addition to which each animal must be given a name, which cannot be altered after registration. The Council reserve the right to refuse any name or prefix without assigning a reason.

The charge for a prefix shall be one guinea. Animals and herd-prefixes may be registered under plural ownership, providing not less than two partners in a partnership or two Directors of a Company are members and that no expelled member participates.

4. All intended registrations shall be notified to the Secretary within one month of the birth of the animal concerned, otherwise they will not be eligible for entry in the Herd Book, except by special permission of the Council. Special forms for the purpose of registration are issued by the Society and supplies are available on application to the Secretary. Descriptions of markings of cattle to be used in connection with these forms are as follows:—

1. White, black points, perfect.
2. White, black points.
3. Over-marked.
4. Under-marked.

In appropriate cases, the words "Red Points" may be substituted for "Black Points."

5. The bona-fide owner of the cow at the time she calves shall be the breeder of the calf.

When a cow has been served by more than one bull the names of all must be given.

6. Before printing any Volume of the Herd Book the Secretary shall be required to prepare and submit to all registering Members a full list of all the items it is proposed to print in the Book under their names, either in the Pedigree, Grading-up or Transfer Sections. The member shall be responsible for revising and correcting such lists and may, if he so desires, cancel the entry of any animal/s previously notified for inclusion in the said Volume of the Herd Book. In this event no fees are payable in respect of the entry or entries so cancelled, but if any additional entries (not previously notified) are to be registered, double entry fees will be charged for each additional entry. The Member shall then return the list, duly approved, to the Secretary who will, in turn, be held responsible for their accurate reproduction in print.

7. The transfer of any registered animal may be recorded on payment of a fee of 10s. No animal bred from a transferred bull or cow will be accepted for registration, unless the transfer of such bull or cow has been registered in the books of the Society.

The onus of registering transfers and the responsibility for payment of transfer fees shall be upon the vendor of the animal or animals concerned.

SHOW RULES AND STANDARD

GOVERNING THE

OF

BRITISH WHITE CATTLE

SHOW RULES.

1. No cattle can be shown as "British White" unless they are registered in, or entered for, the Society's Herd Book.
2. All cattle must be entered for Show under their registered names with Herd Book reference, and the Exhibitor must be the owner and responsible for their description.
3. It is desirable that the judge should have all in-milk females stripped before making his awards.
4. British White Cattle being, above everything, utility cattle, the judge should in his final award give greatest weight to formation, but the dark markings should be preferred to lighter ones, especially in bulls.

STANDARD.

DISTINCTIVE CHARACTERS.—British White Cattle are large, hardy, dual-purpose animals, and breeders and judges should aim at the best combination of milk and meat qualities.

COLOUR.—Must be white with dark points (usually black or red), viz.: Nose, muzzle, eyelids, ear, teats of cows, rudimentary teats of bulls, feet with a splash or spots of colour on the front of each fetlock.

HEADS.—The head must be entirely hornless, quite free from slugs or rudimentary horns.

The heads of bulls should be masculine in character. Those of cows should be fine, feminine and dairylike.

TOP LINE.—The back should be level, not rising at the root of the tail, broad and expanding over loins to hips—pin bones well apart, especially in the bulls.

BODY.—Deep, with the ribs well sprung, the legs short, set four square, and well apart, enabling the animal to move freely, the brisket deep, wide and forward, the hind quarters long from the hips, the buttocks being well fleshed down to the hocks.

UNDERLINE.—Level, but with very prominent milk veins in the cows.

UDDER.—Level, well developed, but not pendulous, the teats of moderate size, set evenly and pointing to the ground.

It is important that the rudimentary teats of bulls should be wide set, well developed, and dark in colour.

SKIN.—Should be fine and handle well.

GRADING-UP REGISTER

REGULATIONS.

1. The Grading-Up Register shall record animals partly of registered British White Cattle blood being graded up to become eligible in the 4th cross for full registration in the Herd Book, or to comply with the provisions of Bye-Law 2 for registration in the Herd Book by inspection. The Register shall be divided into :

SECTION A (1st Cross, etc.). Animals of any age of $\frac{1}{2}$ (one-half) or less of Herd Book registered British White blood, and also animals of any age partly or entirely of Herd Book registered British White blood but not eligible for registration in the Herd Book or other section of the Grading-up Register.

SECTION B (2nd Cross). Calves bred from a Herd Book registered British White bull or cow mated with an animal entered in Section A of the Grading-up Register.

SECTION C (3rd Cross). Calves bred from a Herd Book registered British White bull or cow mated with an animal entered in Section B of the Grading-up Register.

4th Cross. ELIGIBLE FOR HERD BOOK REGISTRATION. Calves bred from a Herd Book registered British White bull or cow mated with an animal entered in Section C of the Grading-up Register.

2. The Grading-Up Register shall be published as a supplement to the Herd Book.

3. The abbreviated formula indicating entry in the Grading-Up Register shall be "G.U.R."

4. Entries for the Grading-Up Register shall be made on the same cards as supplied for pedigree animals, the fact of Grading-up status being entered in the space provided.

5. Grading-Up Register Fee shall be 5s. per animal registered.

6. The 4th Cross, eligible for Herd Book registration shall be subject to full Herd Book fees for the sex of animal concerned.

7. All Grading-up registrations must have a Herd prefix, and will be entered in similar manner to and be subject to the same conditions as Herd Book registrations.

8. Entries in the Grading-Up Register shall be published in alphabetical order of prefixes and the name of animal in each Section, and each Section shall be in two parts—bulls and cows.

9. Each section shall be separately numbered, with "odd" numbers for bulls and "even" numbers for cows.

10. Each Grading-Up Register entry shall comprise prefix and name of animal, section letter, number with G.U.R. affixed, date of birth, sire and dam and name of breeder.

11. Animals bred by mating "G.U.R." bulls with "G.U.R." cows shall be entered in the Grading-Up Register in the earliest Section of either parent, when parents are not both in the same Section. When parents are both in the same Section then the calf shall be entered in that Section, i.e., if a Section A animal is mated with a Section C animal the resultant calf will be entered in Section A. If a Section B animal is mated with a Section B animal the resultant calf will be entered in Section B.

EAR-MARKING SCHEME

All calves born on or after 1st October, 1956, to be eligible for registration in the Herd Book (Pedigree and Grading Up Sections) must be ear-marked by tattooing in the right ear with Designation Letters, allotted by the Society, followed by the Index Letter for the year and number in strict order of birth. Index Letters are as follows: 1956, A; 1957, B; 1958, C; 1959, D; 1960, E.
